Walk towards the subway on the new Platform 2. As you cross under to the old Platform 1, count how many stairs there are in the subway.

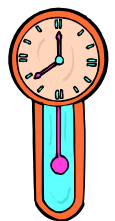
Question 3. Are there the same number each side or is the answer different?


Question 4. You are standing by the regulator clock which controls the time at the station. What is the name on the clock face of the manufacturer?






Question 8. The maximum weight of the Guards Brake Van is painted in white on the outside. Is it?
