This quiz is for children up to about 8 years old and family groups. It is linked to the 16 KHT trail plates route around Kingscote Station. Good luck with the questions and keep an eye out for **Oswald the owl**. He is watching you.

Walk towards the subway on the new Platform 2. As you cross under to the old Platform 1, count how many stairs there are in the subway.

Question 3. Are there the same number each side or is the answer different?



No lorries or vans, so horses and carts were used to move goods, parcels and boxes to and from the station.
