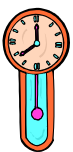

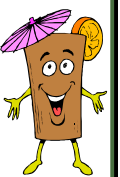

Yellow signals are Distant or warning signals and Red ones are Home signals at key places such as platforms and points. If the signal is horizontal it is at danger and the train must stop.
