Friends of Kingscote



Some background to the Friends of Kingscote (FoK).....

The "Friends of Kingscote" (FoK) was established over 30 years ago. The main purpose of the group is to maintain the station and its immediate lineside areas as they would have been in the 1950's.

At present we have over 130 supporters who subscribe on a yearly basis. The funds generated are used for various projects undertaken by our volunteers. We have a nucleus of about 16 volunteer workers who usually meet on Tuesdays and Saturdays, so if you can spare some time, even on an ad hoc basis, please visit us. An annual Newsletter is produced which is sent to all our members each August.

Kingscote Station was part of the London, Brighton and South Coast Railway from August 1882 to 31st December 1922 after which it became part of the Southern Railway, then British Railways in 1948. In its early years the station won awards for floral displays; a tradition we still try to maintain. It finally closed for passenger traffic in May 1955. This was 8 years before the cuts put forward by Dr Beeching in his plan "The Reshaping of British Railways" in 1963. Incidentally he was a resident of East Grinstead.

In 1960 the Bluebell Railway re-opened the line from Sheffield Park towards Horsted Keynes with the ultimate aim of returning to East Grinstead. In 1964 Kingscote Station was sold and became the property of a private purchaser thus ensuring that at least the station house was preserved. It was repurchased by the Bluebell Railway in 1985. The "Friends of Kingscote" subsequently formed and the team of volunteers set about the huge challenge of renovating the station over the next 9 years.

The railway was extended from Horsted Keynes as far as Kingscote in 1994. This involved a great deal of dedicated work mainly by volunteers. A new bridge had to be constructed near West Hoathly. At Kingscote the "down" (No 2) platform and canopy had been removed by the owner and the subway filled in. A quick glance gives an indication of the brickwork and woodwork involved in restoring that side of the station. A vast number of other tasks were undertaken including the creation of a picnic area, which proved invaluable when the station was the northern terminus for 19 years.

The first passenger train arrived at Kingscote on 23rd April 1994. In March 2013 the line re-opened to East Grinstead. The station then returned to a much quieter life, rather like it would have been in the late 1950s.

Our present day volunteers are very mindful of the efforts made by our former colleagues and are determined to ensure that the station is maintained to the highest possible standard. The "Friends of Kingscote" (FoK) is always looking to recruit new working volunteers and also supporters to help with funding, thus giving our working members the backing they fully deserve.
